
Step By Step Printable

- 1. Set up the flash with the gel
 - For greater coverage of the background, position the light farther away. (Roughly 5 ft/ 1.5m away)
 - 2. Set the flash zoom to the widest possible angle (typically 24mm)
 - 3. If the flash has one, pull out the additional fresnel panel to further widen the beam
 - 4. Put the gel on the flash (make sure to cover any gaps with gaffer's tape)
- 2. Set the power level of the flash
 - If shooting against a white backdrop, start with a lower power (around 1/16, then test and adjust as necessary)
 - 2. If shooting against a black backdrop, start with a higher power (around 1/1, then test and adjust as necessary)
- 3. Bring in your subject
- 4. Add and adjust any light(s) for your subject
- Flag those lights as necessary to maintain background color
- 6. Shoot! e


